Topic: What Makes Me a Me?

Physical Development:

To know how to:

- show good control and co-ordination in small movements.
- move confidently in a range of ways, safely negotiating space.
- handle equipment effectively.
- use some small equipment and tools with independence.
- hold a pencil correctly and have a dominant hand.
- write some recognisable letters independently.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

To know how to:

- play in a group and take turns.
- initiate a conversation and listen to what others say.
- be more confident in new situations/ with unfamiliar people.
- understand I have feelings, and so do my friends.
- know that my actions affect others.
- independently use the toilet and wash my hands.
- eat using a knife and fork.

Communication and Language:

To know how to:

- listen to friends when working in a pair or group.
- stop and listen to an adult when working in the classroom.
- answer a 'who', 'what', 'where', or 'when' question.
- talk about experiences at home and at school.
- ask questions to find out information.
- use 'and', 'so', 'but' when talking.

Literacy:

To know how to:

- recognise my own name, and the names of family members
- write my own name
- know that sounds are linked to letters of the alphabet
- know that words have sounds that can be blended to read.

Mathematics:

To know how to:

- recognise and match objects that are the same.
- sort objects into groups in different ways.
- compare objects according to size, mass and capacity.
- copy and continue simple repeating patterns.

Expressive Arts and Design:

To know how to:

- select and use simple tools when working creatively.
- draw pictures of myself/ family members with some detail.
- engage in role-play alongside others.
- know some familiar songs and rhymes.
- tap out simple rhythms.

Understanding the World: To know how to:

- know that different people have different beliefs.
- know the names of some different religions.
- know the names of adults in school and their role.
- know what makes me unique.
- know how I have changed since I was a baby.
- know who can help me in my local community.
- know some similarities and differences about families.
- know some people look different and that is ok.
