Topic: You've got a friend in me

Physical Development:

Children will learn to name and identify different parts of the body through songs and rhymes. They will learn to attend to toileting needs most of the time themselves. This will be part of our daily routine and children will learn to learn wash and dry hands effectively and understand why this is important.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

Children will learn the new routine and get to know the areas inside and outside of Nursery. They will also learn the names of adults and their peers through songs, games and having chance to share and interact with others through play.

Communication and Language:

Children will learn to listen to others in one-to-one or smaller group time opportunities in free flow and in group time. They will learn to understand the use of objects and learn to use talk in pretending that objects stand for something else in their play such as in our role play areas or small world.

Literacy:

Children will learn to listen to and joins in with stories and poems, when reading one-to-one and in small groups. We look forward to sharing our 'Favourite 5 stories' and enjoy illustrations and texts in the environment.

Mathematics:

Children will learn some number names and number language through play, songs and rhymes. They will also learn to subitise one, two and three objects. Children will learn to explore and build with shapes and objects.

Expressive Arts and Design:

Children will learn new moving, dancing and ring games in group time. They will also learn to use various construction materials by joining pieces, stacking vertically and horizontally, balancing, making enclosures and creating spaces.

Understanding the World:

Children will have the opportunity to share and talk about people who are familiar to them such as family at home. We invite children to bring in family photos to go up in Nursery so we can discuss who is in our families. They will also learn about different occupations, with a focus on people who help us.
